FROM PASTOR ROBERT

Christ is Risen! He has risen indeed! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

So now that we have said the words, what now? What does it mean to worship the risen Christ?

In our Gospel narratives there was a lot of fear and confusion amongst the disciples following the events of Easter Sunday. Most if not all of them were very confused as to what they were supposed to do, and confused regarding all that had happened. In Mark the women who witness the empty tomb run in fear not telling anyone what they had seen. In Matthew's Gospel the religious leaders are scrambling to tell lies about Jesus in order to cover up the resurrection so that no one believes the disciples who were still confused by all that was happening. In Luke the disciples think the women are lying when they hear about the resurrection and choose to ignore them. Finally in John's Gospel the disciples are found hiding in fear before Jesus appears amongst them and brings them some comfort.

As you can see, fear was the primary guiding emotion in the hours, days, and for some weeks, following Christ's resurrection, and that is a pretty typical human response to things that we do not immediately understand. Yet in the these same Gospel narratives there are stories that illustrate how we can conquer that fear, the best of which is found in the Gospel of Luke and it involves two Disciples who were walking down the road one day.

Read Luke 24:13-35

The story opens up with two of Jesus' disciples traveling to the village of Emmaus and along the way they meet a stranger. The stranger professes an ignorance regarding the events of the past few days so the disciples then attempt to explain who Jesus was and all that has happened in Jerusalem. Through this conversation the disciples begin to better understand these events and learn more about how these events relate to scripture.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS



The First Lutheran Church Council met on March 10, 2024. The meeting was called to order by President Audrey Webster.

NOA 1: Ben Ruff brought a request to the Council that an adult Bible study be started up. Pastor Robert shared that he is planning on starting that up both in person and on Zoom once he has had a chance to get a little bit settled and figures out his schedule.

NOA 2: Beth Hunnicut brought an issue with the website not being updated. She is volunteering to pay for the website to be updated. Council shared with her that Mark Hagelberg is working on that. Pastor Rob talked to Mark last week about the

changes he wants to see, like updated events, weekly services posted, etc. Council also shared that there is adequate funding in the approved 2024 budget to update the website.

- <u>Financial Report:</u> Jon Vingerud gave the financial report, which was approved.
- Pastors' Report: Pastor Rob has been here one week and has presided over two. Has met with local area pastors to start building those relationships. He has met with a young couple who wants to get married here. He will be out of the area on April 21st. Normal office work week will be TuesThurs 10-3 and will also likely be around on Mondays and Fridays with fluctuating hours. He does encourage if people want to have a longer conversation or meeting that they work with the church secretary to make an appointment.



This part of the story reminds us of the importance of sharing our beliefs and stories with others. In so doing we not only share a part of who we are and the things that we have experienced but also we are able to deepen and broaden our own understanding of what these experiences mean in our lives. Through conversations with friends and family we are able to hear new ideas, and new ways of looking at things that we might not have thought of before. Conversations with family and friends are important, but so is engaging with those outside our social bubbles. By engaging with those we may not know or may not agree with we are able to both challenge our own ideas and possibly deepen our beliefs. Through deep and enriching conversations with people both inside and outside our community we are able to create space where community can grow and thrive.

In the next part of the story the disciples invite the stranger to come have a meal with them and in that meal the presence of Christ is revealed and the disciples learn that Jesus has in fact been with them this entire time. This helps remind us as Christians that Jesus is truly present when we invite others into fellowship with us. That community is about welcoming outsiders and inviting them into fellowship at our tables. Through this act we reveal a piece of our selves while inviting them to reveal a piece of who they are in an intimate and giving way.

So this Easter season I wish to issue a challenge to all of you. To invite someone who has never been to your home into your home. To have fellowship with them and to treat them to a piece of who you are. By doing this I hope you discover new ways that Christ is being revealed in your life.
